Title: Using Print-on-Demand: Write a Family History Book Your Relatives Will Actually Want to Read

Genealogists love to discover a compiled genealogy of their surname of interest. The thicker the better! But how does the rest of your family feel about reading it. Would they sit down and read it even if YOU were the author? This lecture covers three related issues: how to leave behind your materials when you're gone, how to choose a project that's not as intimidating as a compiled genealogy, and how to construct it in a format that your family will find riveting. Discover how to write creative print-on-demand books that your family won't want to put down!



Walter **Hickey** recently retired from the National Archives after 25 years, having served at both the Waltham and Pittsfield regional archives. He has been a frequent speaker at genealogical societies and conferences throughout New England on Federal records, including those relating to naturalization and immigration.

Naturalization Records Online and More:

This session will present an overview of some of the naturalization records available on line, as well as the records series available from the Genealogy Program of the United States Citizenship & Immigration Service (USCIS),

formerly the Immigration & Naturalization Service (INS). This program makes available several series of genealogically important naturalization files.



Michael J. **Leclerc** is the grandson of French-Canadian immigrants. He started researching those roots back in the 1980s and became a professional genealogist twenty years ago. He currently serves as Chief Genealogist for Mocavo. He is a past board member of the Association of Professional Genealogists, and a former Vice-President of Administration for the Federation of Genealogical Societies. He is the author of numerous articles for scholarly journals and popular genealogical magazines. He is co-editor of Genealogical Writing in the Twenty-First Century: A Guide to Register Style

and More, Second Edition, and editor of the Genealogist's Handbook for New England Research, Fifth Edition.
