!! Valid US passport or passport card is required. If you have a criminal record, there is a strong likelihood that you will be denied entry to Canada, even if you are American. Minor offenses and DUIs on your record are enough to deny you entry. You will be responsible for making your own way home and will forfeit the cost of the trip. !!

Cancellations: Any cancellation received 15-30 days prior to departure may result in a \$50.00 per person penalty; 7 –14 days may have a \$150.00 per person penalty. From 6 days up to departure, there may be no refund. Every effort will be made to refund money if your place is filled by someone on a waiting list. Travel protection is available and will be sent at the time the flyer is sent. Any performance tickets are not refundable unless resold.

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Trois-Rivières/Montreal 2020 Stinerary

Day 1-After meeting up with cousins, we'll stop on our way to Trois-Rivières to visit the Village québécois d'antan, a living-history museum with costumed villagers in real houses and buildings from the 19th and 20th centuries. See how your ancestors lived before emigrating to the states. After enjoying an authentic Québecois meal, we will continue on to our hotel.

Day 2-We begin the day with a guided tour of Trois-Rivière led by our knowledgeable guide. After a tour of the Old Prison, you can get a bite to eat and take a self-guided walking tour. You may choose to visit sites such as a cathedral, an




Monastery & Museum. Then in the evening, enjoy a traditional meal at **Chez Dany**, complete with **maple taffy on snow**.

Day 3-Our drive to Montreal will include several stops. First, we'll visit the Musée des Abénakis in Odanak where we'll discover the cultural richness of the Abenaki First Nation. After a quick lunch, we'll enjoy a walking tour of Old Verchères and learn about our Filles du Roi ancestors. A short boat ride takes us to L'Île-Bouchard for dinner at Vignoble Bouche-Art, a winery on the island. Then on to our Montreal hotel.

Day 4-Our exploration of Old Montreal begins with a guided tour of the **Notre-Dame Basilica** followed by a bus tour to several well-known Montreal sites. After a picnic lunch on **Mont**

Royale, we'll visit Saint Joseph's Oratory, famous for its shrine, crypt church, and great organs. Next, we'll relive 500 years of history at the Château Ramezay. After dinner, we'll return to the Notre-Dame Basilica for the breathtaking Aura, a "three-act multimedia spectacle" of lights.

Day 5-We begin our day at Point-a-Callière's Montreal Archaeology and History Complex. Choose from one of many nearby restaurants and bistros for a quick lunch. Then it's off to Maison Saint-Gabriel for a look at everyday life in New France. As researchers take off for an evening of exploration at the BAnQ Vieux-Montréal, everyone else has a free evening to explore the sites and sounds of the city.

Day 6-Today we explore 2400 years of history at

the Marguerite-Bourgeoys Museum and Notre-Dame-de-Bon-Secours Chapel. Hardy folks can climb to the top of the tower for stunning views of the Old Port. After lunch, we'll drive to the Fur Trade at Lachine National Historic Site to immerse ourselves in the lives of our voyageur ancestors. We'll end the day with dinner and a show at Le Festin du Gouverneur. "Spend an unforgettable evening with the Governor of Ville Marie, Lady Jeanne Mance, a local military Captain and a Fur

trader who all happen to be fine entertainers, singers and musicians."

Day 7-On the way home from Montreal, we'll stop at **Fort Chambly**. The original wooden fort was built in 1665 by soldiers of the Carignan-Salières Regiment. "Discover how French soldiers lived in the era of New France." We return home tired but happy to have walked in the footsteps of our French-Canadian ancestors!
